POSITIVE VOTE

- 2013-14
 - Bonds sold-early 2013
 - Any successful grant proceeds until sale, deducted from total bonds needed
 - Projects initiated and completed over the next 1.5 -2 years
 - Close monitoring, project integrity, any remaining funds after all projects completed, transferred to reduce debt service fund
 - 3 viable buildings, ensure stability for an estimated 25 years
 - Less yearly maintenance costs
 - Energy rebates, energy savings
 - Capital outlay funds reserved and designated to meet future needs

POSITIVE VOTE

- 2013-14
 - Retain magnet programs
 - Retain students
 - Attract new students
 - Retain and attract staff
 - Rental opportunities (fields, gyms)
 - Offer new programs
 - Continue to close achievement/opportunity gap, increase test scores

- 2012-13
 - School Board motion to close middle school
 - Close as of 2013-14 school year
 - Demolish \$4.50 to \$8.00 sq. ft. -- 110,500 sq. ft. (lowest \$497,250)
 - asbestos abatement still required with additional costs
 - Moth Ball
 - Roof Repair \$610,000
 - On-going costs to maintain (monitor heat and dehumidify, maintain HVAC equipment, plumbing and grounds)
 - Loss of rental revenue if mothballed or closed
 - Sell
- 2012-13
 - April- lay off notices required for 2013-14 school year
 - Administration
 - Teachers
 - Office
 - Non-aligned
 - Paraprofessionals
 - Taher layoffs for Food Service
 - 4.0 layoffs for Transportation
 - Possible community education layoffs if programs eliminated

- 2013-14 School Year:
 - Move MS grades to ES and HS
 - Moving Costs \$35,000-\$40,000
 - Rental of leased space or temporary buildings
 - 6th to ES- displaces ECFE, SR, Galaxy- 6th grade returns to self-contained classroom model
 - 7th & 8th to HS- displaces all storages areas build new, rent space
 - Classrooms constructed by adding walls to areas in high school (common areas)
 - 7th & 8th grade incorporated into high school block schedule, longer class periods

- 2013-14 School Year
 - Potential loss of students (77 lost in 2005-06 when threat to close occurred)
 - MS STEM magnet- dissolved, loss of 18 magnet students currently attending the MS
 - MS lose access to outdoor learning areas (school forest, two outdoor classrooms, rain garden, grape plantings and "garden-to-school" program
 - Track program- determined if track unusable
 - September 2013- beginning of school enrollment, unknown
 - November 2013- renew \$395 referendum, or increase

- 2014-15 School Year
 - Referendum Outcome
 - Determine depth of programming reductions
 - All programs would be analyzed, but most recent additions would more than likely be considered for discontinuance such as:
 - EXCEL gifted and talented
 - Secondary Vocational offerings at Wright Technical Center
 - Project Lead the Way
 - All Day Every Day Kindergarten
 - Athletic and Co-curricular activities
 - Enrollment from 13-14 will also determine programming reductions, further staff reductions
